General Permit for Discharge of Stormwater and Dewatering Wastewater Associated with Construction Activities	Connecticut Department of Environmental Protection (CT DEP) – Wastewater permitting	Required if total site disturbance exceeds one acre	\$500 (\$1,000 if >10 acre disturbance)	30 days
Flood Management Certification (FMC)	CT DEP - IWRD	Required for site development affecting natural and/or man-made drainage or a floodplain. NEARLY EVERY PROJECT INVOLVING NEW CONSTRUCTION AFFECTS DRAINAGE AND WILL LIKELY NEED AN <i>FMC</i> .	none	90-120 days
Wildlife Surveys	CT DEP - Wildlife	Required for projects in areas with endangered, threatened, and species of special concern. (see Mansfield NDDB map)	n/a	Varies
Inland Wetlands and Watercourses Permits and General Permits	CT DEP - Inland Water Resources Division (IWRD)	Required for state actions affecting wetlands or watercourses. Each project should include a site specific wetland survey if wetlands are suspected.	No fee for individual permits \$1,000 per general permit	6-12 months (individual permits) 3-4 months (general permits)
General Permit for Hydrostatic Testing Wastewater	CT DEP – Wastewater Permitting	Required for hydrostatic pressure testing of pipelines	\$500 (\$1,000 for natural gas pipelines)	30 days
